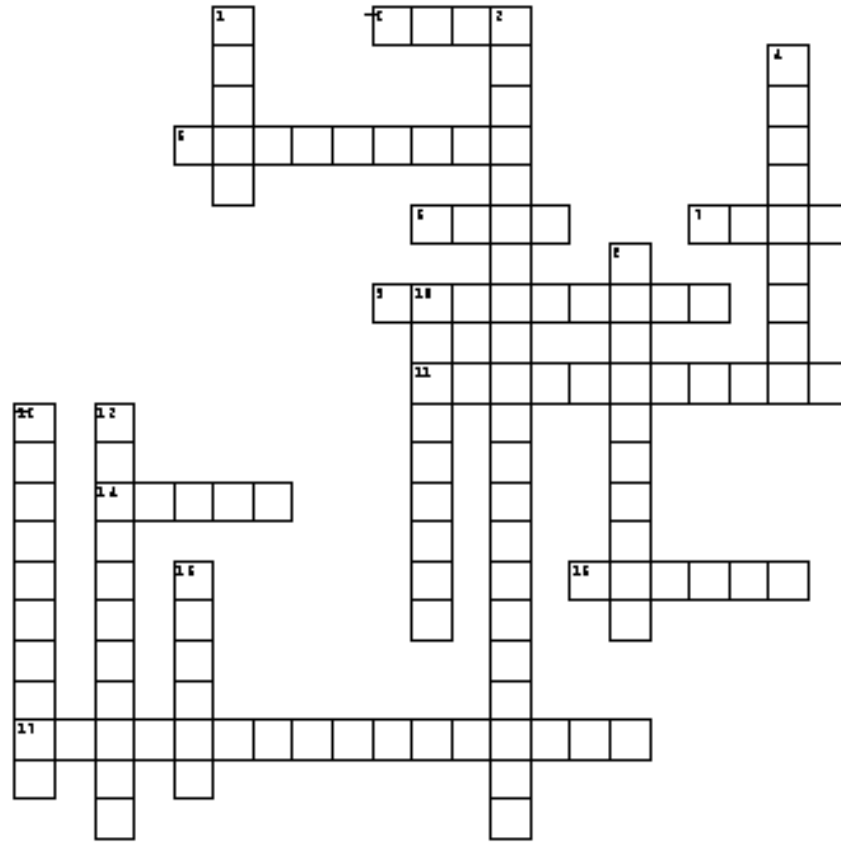




Use the information sheets provided to try and answer the following questions!

- 2 Most stingrays have a this in their tail
- 5 Easily identified by the rounded tip or 'paddle' on the end of their tail
- 6 Baby Sharks are called this
- 7 Sharks are part of this family
- 9 Skin covered by thousands of tiny teeth called this
- 11 This fish was made famous by the character 'Dori' in the animation movie Finding Nemo
- 14 Denticles make skin feel smooth one way and this the other
- 16 Sharks and stingrays enjoy eating these
- 17 Sometimes called Banjo Sharks but we are not a shark (3 words)

Down

- 1 Sharks can replace these anytime if they are lost or damaged
- 3 We are commonly found in Northern Australia and have distinctive blue dots (3 words)
- 4 Sharks and Stingrays have these on their head to help them breath (2 words)
- 8 We are not blind, but got their name from closing our eyes when caught by fisherman (2 words)
- 10 This shark can 'walk' on its pectoral fins forwards and backwards to negotiate small gaps in the reef
- 12 The Wornimi word for Shark
- 13 This is one of the most common sharks seen in NSW (2 words)
- 15 Sharks and some Stingrays have this type of fin on their back and tail
